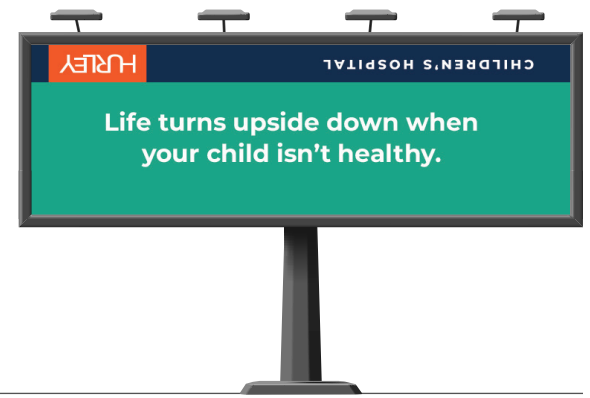

Child & Family Life Services

Hurley's Child and Family Life Services staff play a significant role in delivering the highest level of care to ill or injured children in Hurley's 28-bed Pediatric Unit, 14-bed Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU), 44-bed Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU), Pediatric Emergency Department, and 14-bed Adolescent Behavioral Health Unit.

Our team of Certified Child Life Specialists strive to help children with the emotional, psychological, and developmental challenges associated with illness, injury, or medical treatment through:

Procedure Preparation: Provide developmentally appropriate explanations to reduce trauma or distress. Teach and practice coping skills.

Emotional Support: Encourage children to express emotions through art, play, or conversation.

Play: Help children feel empowered, safe, and understood, and regain some normalcy.

Family Support: Guide parents to support their child emotionally before, during, and after medical experiences; provide strategies to manage their own stress and emotions; and help families stay involved in their child's care, encouraging parents or siblings to take part in play, comfort, or medical activities.

Grief and Loss Support: Help children cope with serious illness or death of a loved one by offering emotional support. Create memories in cases of terminal illness, such as handprints, art projects, or journals, to express feelings and say goodbye.

Advocacy and Communication: Serve as intermediary between child, family, and medical team to ensure child's emotional and developmental needs are communicated effectively.

IN 2025:

- Child Life Specialists supported 1,535 patients
- 26 Hurley volunteers gave over 2,400 hours of their time so kids can keep playing!
- Dogs made 841 Pet Therapy visits
- 7,000+ donations of blankets, stuffed animals, games, and toys were made!

Maternal Fetal Medicine



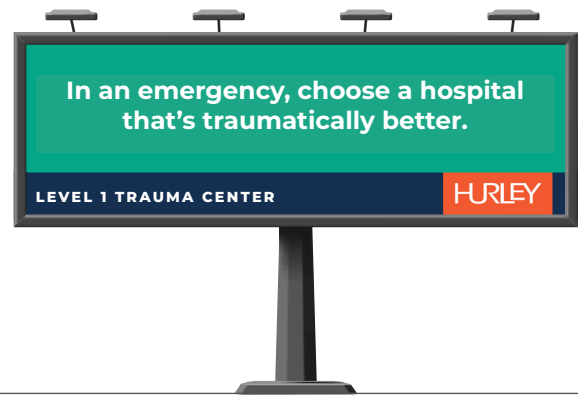
Thanks to the Roots & Wings Foundation, Hurley received over \$1 million in 2025 for very young children and their families, with a particular emphasis on early brain development. These funds provide much-needed support for lactation consultants and the Maternal Fetal Medicine Department, as well as growing a Preconception Through Age 3 Endowment fund at Hurley to ensure impact for years to come.

Breastfeeding plays a critical role in infant brain development. Hurley's three Lactation Consultants are nurses who have completed the highest training available and assist mothers with infants in our Level III NICU, Mother/Baby Unit, and pediatric areas. They help moms overcome obstacles like difficulty latching, inadequate weight gain, low milk supply, and feeding pre-term or multiple infants. They also advise moms in the outpatient breastfeeding clinic or by phone.

DID YOU KNOW...

- Hurley Children's Hospital is the area's only pediatric acute care provider
 - 2,155 babies were born at Hurley in 2025 (70% of all births in Genesee County)
 - Hurley's Level III NICU provides the highest level of care for premature and critically ill infants
- Have heart disease, hypertension, diabetes, autoimmune disease, seizures, blood clotting disease, or infections during or after pregnancy
 - Had pregnancy problems in the past, such as preterm birth
 - Are pregnant with twins, triplets, or more
 - Need special tests or procedures
 - Are pregnant with babies who have birth defects, heart problems, and blood disorders

"With help from Dr. Moisi, my therapists, nurses, and especially my wife, I've made great progress."

On October 11, 2025, life changed instantly for a young couple expecting their first child. Adrian Rivero Mojena and his wife, Elizabet, were on their way to a restaurant. Suddenly, another driver, going very fast, hit their vehicle. They were taken to Hurley. Adrian had a cervical spine injury, 11 broken ribs, and his arm was broken in several places. Elizabet had a broken clavicle and head injury. Fortunately, Elizabet was discharged from the hospital in a week. Adrian, however, had surgery on his back. He then developed an ulcer that needed surgery. He had surgery on his arm, which he almost lost due to his severe injuries.

Adrian spent three months in Hurley's inpatient Rehabilitation Unit to regain as much function as he could. He learned to transfer safely from bed to wheelchair and navigate on his own in the wheelchair. The rehabilitation team taught Elizabet how to assist with Adrian's care, mobility, and daily needs. This helped them prepare for the challenges of returning home together. In January 2026, Adrian came home. He started outpatient rehab at Hurley's West Flint campus.

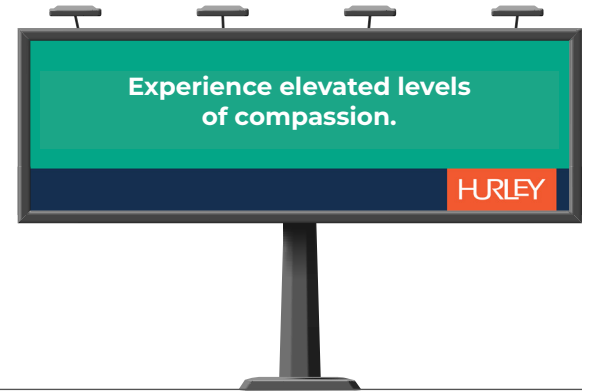
Their daughter, now three months old, was born at Hurley at 36 weeks' gestation.

Adrian reflected, "When I first arrived, I couldn't move my feet and relied completely on a wheelchair. Through months of therapy, determination, and support from my family and care team, I can now take steps on my own."

"Sheer motivation and courage are why he's walking today. He's an amazing young man with an amazing family. He beat all the odds and I couldn't be happier," said his surgeon, Dr. Marc Moisi.

Adrian added, "I'm incredibly grateful for the care I received. They told me I wouldn't walk again. But with help from Dr. Moisi, my therapists, nurses, and especially my wife, I've made great progress. Elizabet was by my side every day and never gave up on me. I would not be walking today without her."





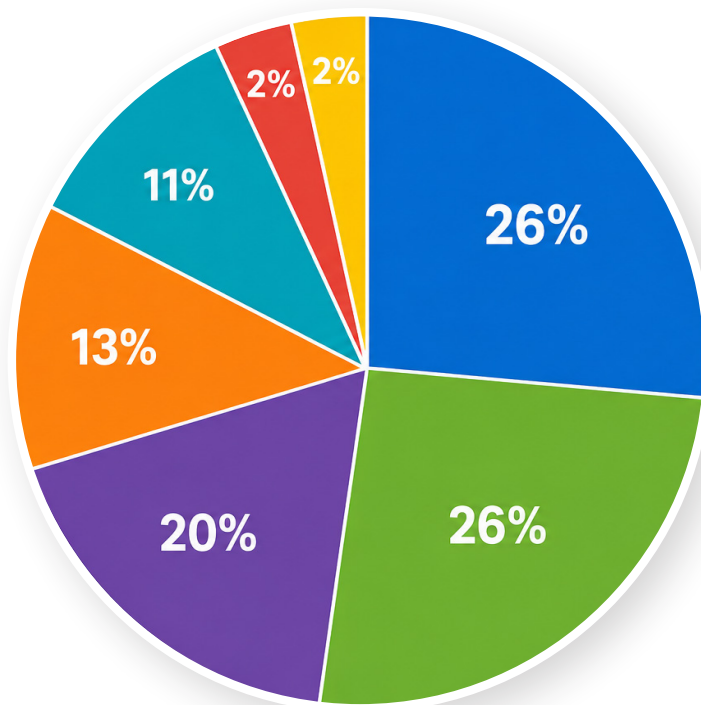
